**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court  
(2015-2016)**

An Act exempting the position of deputy superintendent of police in the city of Lowell from the civil service law.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. The position of deputy superintendent of police in the city of Lowell shall  
2 be exempt from chapter 31 of the General Laws.

3           SECTION 2. Section 1 shall not impair the civil service status of a person holding the  
4 position of deputy superintendent of police in the city of Lowell on the effective date of this act;  
5 provided, however, that this section shall not apply to a person holding the position of acting or  
6 temporary deputy superintendent of police.

7           SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
