An Act including recycling education in the Massachusetts Science and Technology/Engineering Curriculum Framework.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 93 the  
2 following section:-

3           Section 94. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the Department  
4 of Elementary and Secondary Education and the Executive Office of Education, in consultation  
5 with the Department of Environmental Protection, shall include recycling education in the  
6 Massachusetts Science and Technology/Engineering Curriculum Framework. Topics to be  
7 covered shall include, but not be limited to, proper recycling methods, waste reduction,  
8 electronics recycling, and any other topics that the Department of Elementary and Secondary

9 Education, the Executive Office of Education, and the Department of Environmental Protection  
10 deem relevant.
