### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act providing time to develop better measures of and assistance for student learning.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, implementation
- 2 of the department of elementary and secondary education's five-level rating system provided for
- 3 in 603 CMR 203 (1) is suspended until three years after the effective date of this act.
- 4 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the
- 5 commissioner of elementary and secondary education shall not issue new "underperforming" or
- 6 "chronically underperforming" designations for schools or districts, as provided for in sections
- 7 1J and 1K of chapter 69 of the General Laws, until three years after the effective date of this act.
