The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to Massachusetts high school diplomas.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Section 1. Section 1D of Chapter 69 of the Massachusetts General laws, as appearing in
2	the 2012 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting the following paragraph after the
3	words "obtain a competency determination" in line 75:
4	Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, no student who has met all
5	other requirements for a high school diploma, including passing grades in all required courses,
6	shall be denied a diploma because of a score on a state standardized test. This provision shall
7	apply for three school years following the effective date of this act.
