By Mr. Lewis, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 439) of Jason M. Lewis, Chris Walsh, Lori A. Ehrlich, Paul R. Heroux and other members of the General Court for legislation to ensure continued humane animal care and protect family farms in Massachusetts. Environment, Natural Resources and Agriculture.

### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act to ensure continued humane animal care and protect family farms in Massachusetts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 272 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the
- 2 following section:--
- 3 Section 106.
- 4 (a) The purpose of this section, subject to exceptions, is to prohibit the confinement of
- farm animals in a manner that does not allow them to turn around freely, lie down, stand up, and
- 6 fully extend their limbs.
- 7 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a person is guilty of unlawful
- 8 confinement of a covered farm animal if the person is a farm owner or operator who knowingly
- 9 tethers or confines any covered animal, on a farm, for all or the majority of any day, in a manner
- 10 that prevents such animal from:
- 11 (1) Lying down, standing up, and fully extending his or her limbs; and

12 (2) Turning around freely. 13 (c) This section shall not apply: 14 (1) During medical, scientific, or agricultural research. 15 (2) During examination, testing, individual treatment or operation for veterinary 16 purposes. 17 (3) During transportation. 18 (4) During rodeo exhibitions, state or county fair exhibitions, 4-H programs, and similar 19 exhibitions. 20 (5) During the slaughter of a covered animal in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 21 94, sections 139C and 139D of the General Laws, and other applicable laws and regulations. 22 (6) To a pig during the seven-day period prior to the pig's expected date of giving birth. 23 (d) For the purposes of this section: 24 (1) "Calf raised for veal" means any calf of the bovine species kept for the purpose of producing the food product described as veal. 25 26 (2) "Covered animal" means any pig during pregnancy, or calf raised for veal who is kept 27 on a farm. 28 (3) "Enclosure" means any cage, crate, or other structure (including what is commonly described as a "gestation crate" for pigs; or a "veal crate" for calves used to confine a covered 29 30 animal).

- 31 (4) "Farm" means the land, building, support facilities, and other equipment that are
  32 wholly or partially used for the commercial production of animals or animal products used for
  33 food or fiber; and does not include live animal markets.
- 34 (5) "Farm owner or operator" means any person who owns or controls the operation of a 35 farm, and does not include any non-management employee, contractor, or consultant.
  - (6) "Fully extending his or her limbs" means fully extending all limbs without touching the side of an enclosure

- (7) "Person" means any individual, firm, partnership, joint venture, association, limited liability company, corporation, estate, trust, receiver, or syndicate.
- 40 (8) "Pig during pregnancy" means any pregnant pig of the porcine species kept for the 41 primary purpose of breeding.
  - (9) "Turning around freely" means turning in a complete circle without any impediment, including a tether, and without touching the side of an enclosure.
  - (e) Any person who violates any of the provisions of this chapter is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000).
- 47 SECTION 2. This chapter shall take effect one year after its passage.
