An Act relative to improving graduation rates at public colleges and universities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 9 of Chapter 15A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition,
2 is hereby amended by inserting, in line 229, the following words:-

3 (hh) to develop and administer a policy that requires all public institutions of higher
4 education to provide flexibility in graduation requirements for students diagnosed with
5 intellectual and developmental disabilities , including autism spectrum disorders, who are
6 enrolled in credit bearing classes with the intent of earning a degree.
