## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act regarding oversight on eligibility for tuition and fee waivers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 19 of Chapter 15A as appearing in the 2014 Official Edition is hereby amended
- 2 by inserting after the word "courses" in line 13 the following paragraph:-
- 3 ; provided, however, that no full or partial waivers of tuition or fees shall be allowed for
- 4 persons not legally residing in the commonwealth unless said tuition or fee waiver is approved
- 5 by a majority vote of each branch of the general court.
