An Act relative to the emergency administration of certain overdose prevention drugs.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Chapter 112 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official Edition, is hereby  
2 amended by inserting after section 12EE the following section:-

3           Section 12FF. No person, including any and all first responders and sworn law  
4 enforcement personnel, who, in good faith, renders or attempts to render emergency care,  
5 including but not limited to, providing naloxone or other similar opiate overdose antidote  
6 administration, to an individual who has or reasonably appears to have suffered an opioid  
7 overdose, shall be liable in a civil suit for damages as a result of any act or omission on his part  
8 while rendering such emergency care.
