**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act An act relative to youth emancipation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Juvenile Court, in consultation with the Department of Children and
2 Families and the Department of Youth Services, shall establish a pilot program to enable and
3 support youth who are unaccompanied and without a guardian. The pilot shall consider criteria
4 for youth to declare themselves unaccompanied and without a guardian. The pilot shall take into
5 account access to social services and state support, eligibility criteria for housing, and other
6 needs of youth who meet criteria established under the pilot. Further, the pilot shall take into
7 special consideration the needs of youth who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and
8 questioning.
