**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court  
(2015-2016)**  
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An Act to assess the impact of the public welfare system on the health and well-being of children.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following section:-

2 Section 233. The department, in conjunction with other agencies serving children and  
3 families, shall conduct an annual child assessment as part of a child surveillance study on the  
4 impact of the public welfare system on the health and well-being of children from 0 to 18 years  
5 of age. The assessment shall include, but need not be limited to: the measure and assessment of  
6 nutritional status through height and weight measurements; birth outcomes status, including birth  
7 weight; poverty status; school readiness status and safety status, including injury prevalence rates  
8 and hospitalization rates. The assessment shall be submitted to the house and senate committees

- 9 on ways and means, the joint committee on children, families and persons with disabilities, the
- 10 joint committee on health care financing and the joint committee on education by April 1.
