## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to murder soliciation.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

#### 1 SECTION 36. Chapter 265 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official

2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after section 15C the following section:-

3 Section 15D. Any person who, with the intent that another commit murder, solicits,

4 counsels, advises or otherwise entices another to commit murder shall be punished by

5 imprisonment in the state prison for not more than 20 years, or by imprisonment in the house of

6 correction for not more than  $2\frac{1}{2}$  years and a fine of not more than \$1,000.
