In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to mandated reporters.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 51A of Chapter 119 of the General Laws, as amended by chapter 176 of the acts
- 2 2014, is hereby amended by inserting at the end of section (a) the following: ; provided
- 3 however, where a mandated reporter who, in his professional capacity, has reasonable cause to
- 4 believe that a child is suffering physical or emotional injury resulting from abuse inflicted upon
- 5 him which causes harm or substantial risk of harm to the child's health or welfare, including
- 6 sexual abuse shall immediately communicate such condition to the state or local police.
