**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act relative to full disability payments.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1: Section 1 of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the definition of “IV-D agency” the
3 following new definition:-

4 “Law enforcement officer”, any police officer, any auxiliary, intermittent, special, part-
5 time or reserve police officer, any police officer in the employ of a public institution of higher
6 education under section 5 of chapter 15A, any public prosecutor, any municipal or public
7 emergency medical technician, Deputy Sheriff and/or Correction officer.

8 SECTION 2: Section 1 of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014
9 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the definition of “Veteran” the following
10 new definition:-

11 “Violent Altercation”, any interaction between a law enforcement officer in the lawful
12 performance of their duties and an individual that results in an assault with a dangerous weapon

13 as defined in Section 15B of chapter 265, including, but not limited to a shooting, stabbing,
14 bombing, road rage incident, or hostage situation.

15 SECTION 3: Section 7 of chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking
16 subsection (2)(a)(ii) and replacing it with the following new section

17 (ii) A yearly amount of pension equal to 72 per cent of the annual rate of his regular
18 compensation on the date such injury was sustained or such hazard was undergone, or equal to
19 72 per cent of the average annual rate of his regular compensation for the 12-month period for
20 which he last received regular compensation immediately preceding the date his retirement
21 allowance becomes effective, whichever is greater; provided, however, that if an individual was
22 in a temporary or acting position on the date such injury was sustained or hazard undergone, the
23 amount to be provided under this paragraph shall be based on the annual rate of regular
24 compensation in his permanent position on the date such injury was sustained or such hazard was
25 undergone, or the average annual rate of his regular compensation in his permanent position for
26 the 12-month period for which he last received regular compensation immediately preceding the
27 date his retirement allowance becomes effective, whichever is greater; provided, however, that
28 for any employee who was not a member in service on or before January 1, 1988 or who has not
29 been continuously a member in service since that date, the total yearly amount of the sum of such
30 pension and the annuity as determined in accordance with clause (i) shall not exceed 75 per cent
31 of the annual rate of regular compensation as determined in this paragraph; and provided further,
32 that no individual who was a member in service on January 1, 1988, whose allowance is limited
33 by the 75 per cent limitation as established in this paragraph, shall receive an amount of pension
34 that is less than 72 per cent of such individual's regular compensation on January 1, 1988;
35 provided further, that any law enforcement officer, as defined in section 1, whose disability in

36 accordance with subsection (1) is a result of a violent altercation shall receive a yearly amount of
37 pension equal to 100 per cent of the annual rate of his regular compensation in accordance with
38 this section.
