The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to changes to publication of by-laws.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 40A, Section 5 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding
- 2 the following language located in the middle of paragraph two after 'shall be published "...on a
- 3 municipal website or" and also adding "on the municipal website" after publication in a
- 4 newspaper.
- 5 SECTION 2. Chapter 40, Section 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding
- 6 the language "or posted for a period of no less than fourteen days on the town's municipal
- 7 website." located in the bottom half of the section after 'newspaper of general circulation in the
- 8 town.'; and by adding the following language "or posting on the town's municipal website," after
- 9 'or publishing in one or more newspapers,';
- SECTION 3. Majority vote of the City Council or Board of Selectmen is required for a
- municipality to adopt this alternative method of publication. Upon adoption by the municipality,

- 12 the municipal clerk shall file with the Office of the Attorney General written notice of adoption
- 13 of the alternative method of publication.
- SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon passage.
