## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to universal background checks for private gun sales.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1	Section 128A of chapter 140 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby amended by
2	adding the following 3 sentences:- Any sale or transfer conducted under this section shall comply
3	with section 131E and shall take place at the location of a dealer licensed under section 122, who
4	shall transmit the information required by this section for the purchases and sales by utilizing the
5	Massachusetts Gun Transaction Portal established by the Massachusetts Department of Criminal
6	Justice Information Services. A licensed dealer may charge the seller a fee not to exceed \$25 for
7	each sale or transfer electronically submitted on behalf of the seller to the Massachusetts Gun
8	Transaction Portal. Whoever knowingly sells or transfers a firearm in violation of this section
9	shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten thousand dollars or by imprisonment for not more
10	than ten years in state prison or two and one-half years in the house of correction.
