An Act relative to civil service.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any existing law, including without  
2 limitation any act or special act, the appropriate public authority for any City or Town may  
3 revoke the application of Mass General Laws Chapter 31 (“Civil Service”) for a position or  
4 positions in any classification that are filled on or after the effective date of the revocation.  
5 Appropriate public authority will mean, as applicable, the Board of Selectmen, Mayor, City  
6 Manager or Chief Executive Officer of the City or Town. This Act shall take effect immediately  
7 upon its passage.
