The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to non-contiguous farm land.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1 Section 4 of Chapter 61A of the general laws is hereby amended by adding
- 2 at the end of the first paragraph thereof, the following new sentences:
- Whenever an owner holds two or more non-contiguous areas of land in one or more
- 4 subdivisions of the commonwealth equaling not less than five acres, said owner shall have right
- 5 to apply for the provisions of this section provided all parcels are within a 10-mile radius of one
- 6 another, or within the confines of a single municipality. Said acreage shall meet all the
- 7 requirements for the benefits of this section as if the land was contiguous.
