In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)

An Act providing for prisoners of war.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 62 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-

3 (R) income received by a prisoner of war, defined as a person having been regularly
4 appointed, enrolled, enlisted or inducted into the military forces of the United States and having
5 been captured, separated and incarcerated by an enemy of the United States during an armed
6 conflict; and provided further, that the exemption pursuant to this paragraph shall be allowed for
7 the lifetime of the prisoner of war.
