**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act relative to pedestrian safety.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1: Section 18A of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended, after paragraph one, by inserting the following language:

3 The Department of Highways will add to their regulations the following: Whoever, upon
4 any way or in any place to which the public has a right of access, or upon any way or in any
5 place to which members of the public have access as invitees, when walking outdoors in a
6 unilluminated area, after dusk shall be required to wear in a conspicuous manner on their chest
7 and back a minimum of five hundred square inches of reflective material or must be in
8 possession of a function personal luminescent device including but not limited to a flashlight,
9 headlamp, or lantern.
