**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act promoting personal access of driving records.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 1A of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-

3 The registrar shall make a person’s driving records available online for informational
4 purposes. Such records shall be considered unattested and need not be certified with the
5 signature of the registrar, but shall include any suspensions, outstanding tickets or other citations
6 issued to the driver. Such records shall be updated regularly to reflect the most accurate
7 information available, consistent with the way in which attested driving records are maintained
8 for law enforcement agencies.
