The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to foster care recruitment.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the Department
- 2 of Children and Families (DCF) shall investigate and report on the feasibility and best practices
- 3 of launching an organized and focused foster parent recruitment campaign. As part of its report,
- 4 DCF shall include, but not be limited to, information on the costs associated with such a
- 5 recruitment effort, information on current recruitment practices, current costs of recruitment, and
- 6 difficulties impeding DCF's ability to recruit additional foster parents. DCF shall file its report
- 7 with the chairs of the joint committee on children, families and persons with disabilities, as well
- 8 as with the clerks of the house and senate, no later than July 1, 2017.
