The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to interagency efforts to reduce and prevent homelessness.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The executive office of housing and economic development, the executive 2 office of health and human services, the executive office of labor and workforce development, 3 the executive office of education, and the office of administration and finance shall develop and 4 execute a memorandum of understanding to be known as the housing stability and economic 5 mobility memorandum of understanding. The memorandum of understanding shall establish 6 monthly meetings of the secretaries of each executive office and include a report within 6 7 months of the filing of the memorandum of understanding, and every sixth month following, 8 with the following information: the total number of housing units affordable to extremely low 9 income households needed in the Commonwealth and the net increase of units towards that 10 benchmark; programs administered through all state agencies that serve households below 30% 11 of the area median income; the total dollar amount administered by each agency relative to 12 homelessness prevention, services and activities; programs that can be supplemented with federal

13	funding; differences and gaps in program eligibility between identified programs and strategies	
14	for ensuring families receive and maintain services and benefits for which they are eligible;	
15	caseload, demographic, and utilization data for relative programs; and a plan with set timelines	
16	for coordination across agencies to provide, subject to appropriation, access to programs,	
17	services, and benefits for households with incomes below 30% of the area median income and	
18	recommendations for legislative and regulatory changes to implement the plan.

20	The memorandum of understanding shall include the creation of cross-agency teams of	
21	senior, managerial, and front-line staff of each department for the purposes of, but not limited to:	
22	training, developing interagency protocols, policy reforms, minimizing service gaps and	
23	duplication or services, cross agency cost analysis, and developing coordinated systems of care.	
24	The memorandum of understanding shall include a mechanism for ongoing stakeholder	
25	involvement, including consumers, service providers, and advocates.	
26	The memorandum of understanding and reports shall be filed with the governor, the	
27	lieutenant governor, the joint committee on housing, the join committee on children, families,	
28	and persons with disabilities, the joint committee on labor and workforce development, the joint	
29	committee on education, and the house and senate committees on ways and means within nine	
30	months of the passage of this bill.	
31	The memorandum shall facilitate coordination in the delivery of services to households	
32	with incomes below 30% of the area median income to support housing stability and economic	

33 mobility.
