**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act relative to protecting senior health.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the
2 following section:-

3 Section 229: Hospitals shall offer, prior to discharge, immunizations against the influenza
4 virus to all inpatients 65 years of age and older for each calendar year beginning on October 1st
5 and continuing until March 1st of the following year; provided that, such offer is not
6 contraindicated.

7 The immunization shall be provided based upon the availability of the influenza vaccine
8 at the time of the offer and in accordance with the latest recommendations of the Advisory
9 Committee on Immunization Practices of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
