### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act requiring government neutrality in all public construction projects.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, no awarding
- 2 authority shall require or prohibit bidders, contractors, or subcontractors to enter into or adhere to
- 3 agreements with one or more labor organizations, on the same or related projects, or discriminate
- 4 against bidders, contractors, subcontractors, or operators for becoming or refusing to become or
- 5 remain signatories or otherwise to adhere to agreements with one or more labor organizations, on
- 6 the same or other related public works projects.
