By Mr. Mark of Peru, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2706) of Paul W. Mark and others for legislation to establish a Commonwealth solar program to encourage the development of solar photovoltaic technology. Telecommunications, Utilities and Energy.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act relative to solar power and the green economy.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 25A of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
2 section 11I the following sections:-

3 Section 11J. The department shall establish a Commonwealth Solar Program to
4 encourage the development of solar photovoltaic technology by residential, commercial,
5 governmental and industrial electric customers throughout the Commonwealth. The program
6 shall be structured to achieve 17.5 per cent solar electricity, measured by the sale of retail
7 electricity to end-use customers in the commonwealth, by December 31, 2025, and 25 per cent
8 solar electricity by December 31, 2030.

9 SECTION 2. Section 11F of said chapter 25A of the General Laws, as so appearing, is
10 hereby amended by striking out, in lines 16 and 17, the words “and (3) an additional 1 per cent of
11 sales thereafter.” and inserting in place thereof the following words:- “(3) an additional 1 per

12 cent of sales every year until December 31, 2017; (4) an additional 2 per cent of sales until
13 December 31, 2018, and (5) an additional 3 per cent of sales every year thereafter .”

14 SECTION 3. Section 139 of Chapter 164, as so appearing, is hereby amended by striking
15 out subsection (f) and inserting in place thereof the following subsection:-

16 (f) The maximum amount of generating capacity eligible for net metering by a
17 municipality or other governmental entity shall be 10 megawatts.
