**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act relative to town meeting members in the town of Burlington.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 8 of chapter 686 of the acts of 1970, as amended by section 1 of
2 chapter 92 of the acts of 2011, is hereby further amended by striking out section 8, as so
3 appearing, and inserting in place thereof the following section:-

4 Section 8. A Town Meeting Member is not eligible to hold any other elected position in
5 town government as set forth by Massachusetts Special Acts of 2007 Chapter 216. A Town
6 Meeting Member may be employed by the Town. A Town Meeting Member may serve as any
7 or all of the following:

- 8 • Member of any committee(s) appointed by the Moderator;
- 9 • Member of any advisory committee(s) appointed for a special temporary purpose
- 10 by the Selectmen, School Committee, or any other Town Board;
- 11 • Officer of elections; and

12 • Member of a political party's town committee.

13 In addition to the above, only one other appointed position may be held by a Town
14 Meeting Member.

15 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage
