An Act regarding background checks on foster parents.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Section 51F of Chapter 119 of the General laws is hereby amended by inserting after the  
2 third paragraph the following:

3           DCF Background Record Check reports of Central Registry Records on a foster parent  
4 consisting exclusively of 51A reports determined to be “invalid”, “unsupported” or by some  
5 other designation conclude that the foster parent was not found to be responsible for abuse or  
6 neglect of a child, shall be reported to the hiring authority as “no record”. Said report shall be  
7 considered a full accounting of the foster parent’s central registry record. Nothing in this section  
8 shall prevent the Department from maintaining and using this data in investigating future 51A  
9 reports.
