**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court  
(2017-2018)**

An Act relative to retired police cruisers.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 92 of chapter 148 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014  
2 Official Edition in hereby amended by striking out the words, in lines 12 and 13 “shall be  
3 punished by a fine of not less than ten nor more than five hundred dollars” and inserting in place  
4 thereof the following:-

5 “shall be punished by a fine of not less than one thousand nor more than twenty-five  
6 hundred dollars.”
