**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act relative to home improvement contractors.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 271 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition,
2 is hereby amended by adding the following section:-

3 Section 51. A contractor or subcontractor as defined by section 1 of chapter 142A shall
4 be guilty of a felony and shall be subject to the penalties set forth in this section if:

5 (1) he or she leaves the commonwealth and goes into another state without making
6 reasonable provisions for the completion of contracted work; or

7 (2) willfully and while having the financial ability or earning capacity to comply with
8 an order of judgment pursuant to section 8 of chapter 142A fails to comply with such judgment.

9 The penalty for violation of this section shall be by imprisonment in the state prison for
10 not more than 5 years or by imprisonment in jail or the house of correction for not more than 2½
11 years, or by a fine of not more than \$20,000, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

12 SECTION 2. Chapter 276 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby amended by
13 inserting after section 14 the following section:-

14 Section 14A. If a person charged with the crime set forth in section 51 of chapter 271
15 flees the commonwealth, the governor shall issue a warrant of arrest as provided in section 20I
16 and demand, in writing to the governor of the state where the person demanded is present, the
17 delivery of the accused. The demand shall state that such person was present in the
18 commonwealth at the time of the commission of the alleged crime and that such person has
19 broken the terms of his or her bail or recognizance. A copy of such crime charged shall be
20 authenticated by the governor and provided to the governor of the other state.
