**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act protecting police officers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 13D of Chapter 265, as appearing in the 2014 Official Edition, is hereby
2 amended by adding at the end thereof the following new paragraph:-

3 Whoever commits an assault or an assault and battery upon a law enforcement officer,
4 when such an officer is engaged in the performance of their duties, that results in bodily injury
5 shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for not more than 5 years or in the house of
6 correction for not more than 2 1/2 years, or by a fine of not more than \$5,000, or by both such
7 fine and imprisonment. Second or subsequent assaults upon a law enforcement officer, when
8 such an officer is engaged in the performance of their duties, or assaults and battery, resulting in

9 bodily injury shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$10,000, and imprisonment for not less
10 than 1 year in a house of correction or more than 10 years in state prison.
