#### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act requiring reports on the state's implementation of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 1A of Chapter 69 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following new paragraph at the end thereof:-
- 3 The commissioner shall monitor and evaluate the implementation of the federal
- 4 McKinney-Vento law, so-called, in all districts in the commonwealth and shall report findings
- 5 and any proposed recommendations to improve said implementation to the board and to the
- 6 legislature on an annual basis. The commissioner's report shall include, but not be limited to, an
- 7 annually updated estimate of the number of homeless and unaccompanied students in the state;
- 8 the extent to which the state is complying with, and meeting the goals of, the federal law; how
- 9 the academic achievement, graduation, drop-out and attendance rates of homeless and
- unaccompanied students compares with non-homeless students, and with other subgroups,

- 11 including low-income, at-risk, Sped, ELL, and ethnic minority students; an analysis of the state
- and local barriers to meeting the goals of the law and recommendations on how to address such
- 13 barriers.
