**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act relative to workers compensation coverage for officers and directors of non-profit associations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Subsection (4) of Section 1 chapter 152 of the General Laws, as appearing
2 in the 2014 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the fifth paragraph the
3 following paragraph:- This chapter shall be elective for an officer or director of a non-profit
4 entity or corporation, as defined by the Internal Revenue Code, who is not compensated.
5 Notwithstanding Section 46, these provisions shall apply only if the corporate officer or director
6 provides the director of industrial accidents with a written waiver of his or her rights under this
7 chapter. Said director shall promulgate regulations to carry out the purpose of this paragraph.
8 Violations of this paragraph shall subject the non-profit corporation to the penalties set forth in
9 Section 25C.
