An Act relative to the safe treatment of pain.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 148 of Chapter 112 of the General Laws shall be amended by  
2 adding in the second paragraph after the word “function.”, the following language:

3           “Any insertion of a filiform/metal needle for therapeutic purpose into a body constitutes  
4 the practice of acupuncture.”
