**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act relative to retirement eligibility.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 5 of Chapter 32 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting, after subsection (a), the following new
3 subsection:-

4 (a ½) State officials, elected to the office by popular vote, on or after April 2, 2012, must,
5 in order to be eligible for retirement under superannuation, have attained 67 years of age and
6 have a minimum of 10 years of creditable service.
