**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act relative to taxation after a short-sale of a mortgaged property.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Notwithstanding any law or special law to the contrary, a deficiency in a mortgage after
- 2 disclosure shall not be considered income for the purpose of Massachusetts taxation and shall not
- 3 be taxed as income of the mortgager or under any other tax category.
