**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act supporting local business retention.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 5 of chapter 59 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official Edition, is
2 hereby amended by adding the following clause:-

3 "Fifty-eighth. Upon the acceptance of this section by a city or town, the board of
4 assessors may grant an abatement of up to 50 per cent of the total tax assessed on a small
5 business's commercial real estate and personal property if said small business can prove a
6 hardship, with respect to such assessed property, caused by a public works project, or by actions
7 taken by a municipal utility company. Any such abatement shall expire when the hardship ends,
8 or after no more than two consecutive years. The city or town shall establish a maximum number
9 of employees, or maximum gross receipts in the preceding calendar year, for which a small
10 business may be eligible for this abatement. Said small business must apply for such abatement
11 by the one-year anniversary of the end of the actions causing the hardship."
