**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act designating a certain park in the town of Hingham as the Eugene F. Creedon Memorial Park.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1: The park located on Shipyard Drive in the town of Hingham under the care
2 and control of the department of conservation and recreation, that is shown as Parcel 8, on the
3 Landing Ship Tank Service Monument Relocation Exhibit identifying an area of a monument
4 and easement within the park, which is part of document No. 736623, filed with the Plymouth
5 registry district of the Land Court on September 9, 2015, and that is adjacent to the east of the
6 department's building at 30 Shipyard Drive, known as Building 45, and related parking and
7 storage area, shall be designated and known as the Eugene F. Creedon Memorial Park, in
8 recognition of Eugene Creedon's advocacy on behalf of World War II veterans. The department
9 of conservation and recreation shall erect and maintain suitable markers bearing that designation
10 in compliance with department standards.

11 SECTION 2: This act shall take effect upon its passage.
