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**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**
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An Act increasing voter participation in primary elections.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1: A special commission is hereby established pursuant to section 2A of
2 chapter 4 for the purpose of making an investigation and study relative to increasing voter
3 participation in primary elections. Said commission shall specifically investigate the
4 implementation of a “Top Two Primary system” as well as party convention rules relative to
5 party nominations of candidates, and primary election dates. The commission shall consist of 2
6 members of the senate, 1 of whom shall be appointed by the Senate President, 1 of whom shall
7 be appointed by the minority leader, 1 of whom shall act as co-chairperson; 2 members of the
8 house of representatives, 1 of whom shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of
9 representatives, 1 of whom shall be appointed by the minority leader 1, 1 of whom shall act as
10 co-chairperson; the secretary of the commonwealth or their designee; the president of the

11 Massachusetts Town Clerks' Association or their designee; the president of the Massachusetts
12 City Clerks' Association or their designee; the executive director of Common Cause
13 Massachusetts or their designee; and 1 person from each of the political parties as defined in
14 section 1 of chapter 50 of the General Laws eligible to conduct primary elections at the next
15 following biennial state election.

16 Said commission shall report to the general court the results of its investigation and study
17 and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its
18 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the senate and the clerk of the
19 House of Representatives six months after the enactment of this legislation.
