An Act to regulate Carfentanil.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 31 of chapter 94C of the General Laws is hereby amended by, in
2 paragraph (a) inserting after the word, " (10) Betaprodine", the following: "(xx) Carfentanil,
3 Acetyl fentanyl, furanyl fentanyl, and butryl fentanyl "

4 SECTION 2. Section 32E of chapter 94 C of the General Laws is hereby amended by
5 inserting after paragraph c-1/2 the following new section; "(c-3/4) (c) Any person who trafficks
6 in carfentanil or any salt or derivative thereof, by knowingly or intentionally manufacturing,
7 distributing or dispensing or possessing with intent to manufacture, distribute, or dispense or by
8 bringing into the Commonwealth a net weight of 5 grams or more of carfentanil or any salt or
9 derivative thereof, or a net weight of 5 grams or more of any mixture containing carfentanil or
10 any salt or derivative thereof, shall be punished by a term of imprisonment in state prison not to
11 exceed 20 years."
