In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act establishing an additional license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on premises.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Notwithstanding Section 17, of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the
2	licensing authority for the Town of Milford may grant one additional license for the sale of all
3	alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises under section 12 of said Chapter 138, to Dee
4	Zee, Inc.,35 Anne Lane Pascoag, Rhode Island, d/b/a Trattoria, GiGi, located at 198 East Main
5	Street, in town of Milford, Massachusetts. The license shall be subject to all of the other
6	provisions of said Chapter 138.

Notwithstanding any general or special law or any rule or regulation to the contrary, the licensing authority shall not approve the transfer of the license to any other location but it may grant the license to a new applicant at the same location if the applicant files with the licensing authority a letter in writing from the department of revenue and a letter from the department of unemployment assistance indicating that the license is in good standing with those departments and that all applicable taxes, fees and contributions have been paid. 13 If the license granted under this section is cancelled, revoked or no longer in use at the 14 location of original issuance, it shall be returned physically, with all of the legal rights, privileges 15 and restrictions pertaining thereto, to the licensing authority which may then grant the license to 16 a new applicant at the same location and under the same conditions as specified in this act.

17 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
