An Act establishing a sick leave bank for Deirdre Dacey, an employee of the Parole Board.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Section 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the parole board  
2 shall establish a sick leave bank for Deirdre Dacey, an employee of the parole board. Any  
3 employee of the department may voluntarily contribute 1 or more sick, personal or vacation days  
4 to the sick leave bank for use by Deirdre Dacey. Sick leave bank days shall not be used for  
5 absences unrelated to the illness or disability that necessitated the establishment of the sick leave  
6 bank as determined by the department. Whenever Deirdre Dacey terminates employment with  
7 the department or requests to dissolve the sick leave bank, any remaining time in the sick leave  
8 bank shall be transferred to the extended illness leave bank.
