By Representative McMurtry of Dedham and Senator Rush, a joint petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4164) of Paul McMurtry and Michael F. Rush (by vote of the town) that the town of Dedham be authorized to grant an additional license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises in said town. Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure. [Local Approval Received.]

**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act authorizing the town of Dedham to grant an additional license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, or any
2 other general or special law to the contrary, the licensing authority of the town of Dedham may
3 grant an additional license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises
4 under section 12 of said chapter 138. The license shall be subject to all of said chapter 138,
5 except said section 17.

6 SECTION 2. The licensing authority shall restrict the license granted under section 1 to
7 entities located at the premises located at 930 Providence highway in the town of Dedham. The
8 license issued pursuant to this act shall not be transferable to any other locations, persons,
9 corporations, or organizations.

10 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding sections 12 and 77 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the
11 licensing authority for the town of Dedham may restrict the license issued pursuant to this act to
12 holders of common victualler licenses.

13 SECTION 4. The additional licenses authorized by this act shall be subject to an original
14 application fee of \$5,000 more than the annual fee for existing alcoholic beverage licenses in the
15 town of Dedham. The additional \$5,000 fee shall be deposited into an economic development
16 account in the town of Dedham and expended consistently with the purposes of such account.

17 SECTION 5. The license granted under this act if revoked or no longer in use, may be
18 granted by the licensing authority to new applicants who meet the criteria of this act.

19 SECTION 6. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
