By Mr. Walsh of Framingham, a petition (subject to Joint Rule 12) of Chris Walsh and others for legislation to establish a center for workforce development programs for persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities within the Department of Career Services. Labor and Workforce Development.

**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act to enhance employment outcomes and strengthening workforce development programs for persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 23H: of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
2 Section 11 the following new section:

3 Section 12. (a) There shall be established a Statewide Center for Innovation and Change
4 offering workforce development programs for persons with intellectual and developmental
5 disabilities. The Statewide Center for Innovation and Change shall support staff development
6 and innovation leading to an increased ability to place and support persons with disabilities in
7 typical employment settings.

8 (b) The Center shall work with community rehabilitation programs in adopting policies,
9 procedures and practices that increase the placement of individuals with intellectual and
10 developmental disabilities. The Statewide Center for Innovation and Change shall offer training
11 and intensive technical assistance, as well as program evaluation to those community

12 rehabilitation programs and work with school age children, beginning at age 14 and adults with
13 intellectual disabilities. These individuals may be referred to the Statewide Center for Innovation
14 and Change by the Department of Developmental Services offering employment for such
15 individuals. The Center may partner with the Department of Developmental Services to provide
16 funds to direct service provider agencies in order to modify their structures, increase staff skills
17 and correspondingly increase their placement rates for persons with intellectual and
18 developmental disabilities served.

19 The Statewide Center for Innovation and Change shall recruit employers to assist in the
20 identification of jobs as well as support the advancement of these individuals in the workplace.
21 The center shall be run by a university center for excellence in disabilities, based at a public
22 research university located in Massachusetts.
