Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. The commissioner of the department of public health, in consultation with the commissioner of the department of energy resources, shall conduct a study on the reduction of contaminants in wood pellet fuel sold in the Commonwealth, including, but not limited to arsenic, chromium, copper, construction debris, preservative treated and painted wood and to establish methods to reduce the health impacts of using wood pellet fuel and provide a recommendation as to advisability of enacting statutory and or regulatory changes to reduce said contaminants. The study report and recommendation shall be submitted to the joint committee on environment, natural resources and agriculture, the joint committee on telecommunications, utilities and energy, and the house and senate committees on ways and means within 1 year of passage of this act.
