**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act allowing full faith and credit to personal identification.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 34B of chapter 138 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word “card”, in line 18, the following
3 words:-or an out of state driver’s license that has been validated by use of a magnetic
4 identification card reader machine,

5 SECTION 2. Said section 34B of said chapter 138, as so appearing, is hereby further
6 amended by inserting after the word “card”, in line 25, the following words:- or an out of state
7 driver’s license that has been validated by use of a magnetic identification card reader machine,

8 SECTION 3. Said section 34B of said chapter 138, as so appearing, is hereby further
9 amended by inserting after the words “sixty-nine”, in line 30, the following sentence:- The
10 commission shall promulgate rules and regulations to enforce this section, including any
11 regulations necessary to ensure the quality control in the use of a magnetic identification card
12 reader machines and the type of information that can be maintained or electronically recorded
13 when using a magnetic identification card reader machine.
