An Act relative to recess for elementary school children.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Section 1G of Chapter 69 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting at the end  
2 thereof the following subsection:-

3           (1) The department shall survey district policies regarding the time, frequency, and  
4 structure of recess offered to students in grades kindergarten through five, as well as the extent to  
5 which schools are in compliance with such district policies. The department shall deliver the  
6 findings to the chairs of the joint committee on education by December 31, 2018.

7           (2) The department shall issue guidelines for districts to use when developing policies on  
8 recess, including appropriate length of time, frequency, and structure for students in grades  
9 kindergarten through five.
