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**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act authorizing the town of Dedham to convert a license for the sale of wine and malt beverages not to be drunk on the premises to a license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages not to be drunk on the premises.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the
2 licensing authority of the town of Dedham may convert 1 license for the sale of wine and malt
3 beverages not to be drunk on the premises pursuant to section 15 of said chapter 138 to R&Z
4 Greige, Inc. located at 77 Cedar Street/ 7 Sanderson Avenue in the town of Dedham to a license
5 for the sale of all alcoholic beverages not to be drunk on the premises under section 15 of said
6 chapter 138 to R&Z Greige, Inc. to be located at 77 Cedar Street/ 7 Sanderson Avenue in the
7 town of Dedham. The license shall be subject to all of said chapter 138 except section 17.

8 (a) The licensing authority shall not approve the transfer of the license to any other
9 location, but it may grant the license to a new applicant at the same location if the applicant files
10 with the licensing authority a letter from the department of revenue and a letter from the
11 department of unemployment assistance indicating that the license is in good standing with those
12 entities and that all applicable taxes, fees, and contributions have been paid.

13 (b) If the license granted under this section is cancelled, revoked or no longer in use
14 at the location of original issuance, it shall be returned physically, with all of the legal rights,
15 privileges and restrictions pertaining thereto, to the licensing authority which may then grant the
16 license to a new applicant at the same location under the same conditions as specified in this act.

17 (c) All licenses granted pursuant to this act shall be issued within 12 months upon its
18 passage.

19 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
