An Act authorizing the town of Orleans to exempt all municipal seasonal beach facilities from the applicable provisions of the state plumbing code.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, or the  
2 provisions of the state plumbing code, 248 CMR 10.06, the town of Orleans is authorized to use  
3 PVC plastic pipe and fittings for waste disposal, drains and ventilation in the construction or  
4 replacement of municipal seasonal facilities for beach administration, restrooms, showers and  
5 food service at all municipal beaches.

6           SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
