## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

Resolve An Act establishing an agricultural tourism study commission.

1	Resolved, that there shall be a special commission on agricultural tourism to study
2	opportunities that support, expand and enhance agricultural tourism in the commonwealth. The
3	commission shall review: state and municipal laws and regulations relative to agricultural
4	zoning; policies and grant programs offered by the department of agricultural resources,
5	including the agricultural preservation restriction program; programs offered by the office of
6	travel and tourism; and national best practices to implement agricultural tourism.
7	The commission shall consist of the following 11 persons: the commissioner of the
/	The commission shall consist of the following TT persons, the commissioner of the
8	department of agricultural resources or a designee, who shall serve as the chair; the executive
9	director of the office of travel and tourism or a designee; the house and senate chairs of the joint
10	committee on tourism, arts and cultural development; the house and senate chairs of the joint
11	committee on the environment, natural resources and agriculture; the commissioner of the
12	department of public health or a designee; and 4 members to be appointed by the governor, 1 of
13	whom shall be a representative of the Massachusetts Municipal Association, Inc.; 1 of whom
14	shall be a representative of the Massachusetts Farm Bureau Federation, Incorporated; and 2 of
15	whom shall be representatives from the agricultural tourism industry.

16 The commission shall file its report, together with the results of its study,

17 recommendations and drafts of its recommended legislation, with the clerks of the house of

18 representatives and the senate, the joint committee on the environment, natural resources and

- 19 agriculture and the joint committee on tourism, arts and cultural development not later than
- 20 December 31, 2019.
