In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to half-staff notifications.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Section 6A of Chapter 2 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 official edition is
2	hereby amended by adding at the end the following paragraph:-

3 (h) All military service members (Army, Air Force, Coast Guard, Marine Corps, Navy, 4 National Guard, and Reserves) residing in Massachusetts, and performing military duty under 5 official orders, who are killed while in an active duty status, will be honored by having flags 6 throughout the Commonwealth flown at half-staff from the day of death until sunset of the day 7 of interment in accordance with such orders or instructions as may be issued by, or at the 8 direction of the governor. The remains of POWs/MIAs repatriated within the Commonwealth 9 shall have the flag half-staffed on the day of arrival within the Commonwealth through the day 10 of internment. Additionally, flags will be half-staffed each year on national POW/MIA Day, 11 observed across the nation on the third Friday of September, from sunrise to sunset.
